DISTRIBUTIONS COMPLETE IN VANUATU

With the help of CARE Vanuatu, we recently distributed 2,000 ShelterKits to families in Vanuatu, following Cyclone Harold. We also continue to provide aid to:

- Philippines (in response to Cyclone Vongfong)
- India (supporting 1,500 families affected by Cyclone Amphan)
- Ethiopia (supporting 3,500 families affected by conflict and flooding)
- Cameroon (supporting 7,800 families affected by conflict)
- Tanzania (in response to flooding)
- Burkina Faso (supporting 600 displaced families).

COVID-19 OPERATIONS UPDATE

Coronavirus has presented a huge challenge to our organisation, but, for those families left in despair following disaster, the challenge is far greater. This means our aid is needed now more than ever. The ban on international travel has made deploying our Response team difficult but, our links with local partners worldwide have enabled us to get aid families in need. Our ShelterBoxes now include soap, handwashing basins and PPE, and families are receiving virtual trainings on how to use their aid items, and how to prevent the spread of the virus.

MEET BUSHAARO

"A SOUL WITH NO SHELTER IS THE MOST VULNERABLE INDIVIDUL IN THE COMMUNITY, SHELTER IS ONE OF THE BASIC HUMAN RIGHTS, LET US KEEP IT".

These are the powerful words of 16 year old Bushaaro. She lives in a displacement camp in Somaliland, and has been the sole carer of her six younger siblings, since her Mum passed away in 2015. Last year, thanks to your support, we were able to distribute aid to Bushaaro, and hundreds of others living in the same displacement camp, with the support of our partner ActionAid.



"MY HOPE INCREASED A LITTLE WHEN ACTIONAID CAME TO THE CAMP AND TOLD US OF THEIR PROJECT. NOW I HAVE A GREEN BOX CONTAINING EMERGENCY SHELTER AND OTHER ITEMS. THE MOST IMPORTANT THING I GOT FROM THE BOX WAS THE SOLAR LIGHT, OUR FIRST NIGHT WITH THE SOLAR LIGHT WAS THE MOST EXCITING NIGHT WE HAD AFTER THE DEATH OF OUR MOTHER".



LEARN MORE ABOUT SHELTERBOX: WHAT'S IN A BOX?

Our ShelterBoxes are never quite the same - they're tailored to meet the unique needs of each community we serve. But, they typically include:

- Tents (for shelter).
- Blankets, groundsheets and mattresses (for warmth/comfort).
- Water purifiers (so safe water is one less thing for families to worry about).
- Cooking equipment (so families can spend quality time cooking together).
- Solar light (so families can continue working and cooking after dark).
- Tools (to help families make repairs and rebuild their homes).

ROTARY: WHERE IT ALL BEGAN

Did you know that our story starts with Rotary? That's right - in 2000, the Rotary Club of Helston Lizard, in Cornwall, championed a simple idea to package up essential shelter items, in our now-iconic green ShelterBoxes, to help those who were left with nothing after disaster. We are so proud that Rotary remains at the heart of ShelterBox, and are endlessly grateful for the support of Rotarians and Rotary Clubs worldwide, who enable us to provide hope to those who need it most.
