After his home in the Philippines was destroyed by Typhoon Vongfong in May, Alejandro received a ShelterKit - *[when I collected the aid] "I had a good and nice feeling. Now we will be protected from the rain and sun. We can eat around the table, rain or shine. I can concentrate with work, not worrying about the security and comfort of my family. Our daughter is smiling more now, because according to her, we have a new house"*.

Despite the challenges 2020 presented, your passion and generosity remained constant - and it is this incredible support that enabled us to give so many families, like Alejandro's, a place to call home. Thank you endlessly.

Together, we have accomplished so much. However, with 104 million people displaced worldwide (more than any other time in recorded history), the need for the work of ShelterBox, has never been greater.

21 YEARS OF IMPACT



2000

ShelterBox is founded as a millennium project by the Rotary Club of Helston-Lizard, with a goal of helping 10 families per year.



2001

Gujarat earthquake, India and Pakistan. First distribution of 143 ShelterBoxes sent to families whose homes were destroyed.



2002

ShelterBox provides aid in response to conflict in Afghanistan and Angola. ShelterBox goes global, as ShelterBox USA is formed.



2003

ShelterBox distributes almost 800 ShelterBoxes in response to disasters in Ukraine, Algeria, Iraq, Liberia, Uganda, and Iran.



2004

Indian Ocean tsunami. ShelterBox becomes humanitarian leader in the provision of emergency shelter, distributing over 12,400 boxes.



2005

ShelterBox responds to disasters in India, Sri Lanka, the Maldives, Indonesia, Serbia, USA, Pakistan, Bahamas and Guatemala.



2006

ShelterBox New Zealand is established in Dunedin - becoming ShelterBox's third international affiliate.



2007

The Duchess of Cornwall becomes the President of ShelterBox.

2008

ShelterBox deploys support to its 50th country, the Democratic Republic of Congo, supporting families displaced by conflict.



2009

The iconic white dome Standard Relief Tent is designed and created by Vango, and they become our official aid partner.



2010

7.0 magnitude earthquake, Haiti. ShelterBox provides 28,000 ShelterBoxes - emergency shelter for hundreds of thousands displaced.



2011

ShelterBox provides aid in New Zealand for the first time - delivering ShelterBoxes in response to the Christchurch earthquake.



2012

ShelterBox becomes Rotary's official project partner in disaster relief, in recognition of the shared vision.



2013

Typhoon Haiyan, Philippines. ShelterBox supports over 7,000 families in response.



2014

Super Typhoon Hagupit, Philippines. Essential relief is provided to 1,000 families. Shelter Kits are distributed for the first time.



2015

Gorkha earthquake, Nepal. Shelter Kits and supplies are deployed.

2016

Cyclone Winston, Fiji is the strongest storm recorded in the Southern Hemisphere. Supplies are distributed to 1,250 families.



2017

ShelterBox responds to Hurricane Irma in the Caribbean - the most powerful hurricane ever recorded in the Atlantic Ocean.



2018

ShelterBox responds to the earthquake and tsunami in Indonesia. ShelterBox receives first Nobel Peace Prize nomination.



2019

Cyclone Idai, Malawi. Second Nobel Peace Prize nomination.

2020

ShelterBox provides aid to over 40,000 families in 11 countries, including the Philippines, Tanzania, Ethiopia and Vanuatu.
