Right now, more than 104 million people around the world have been made homeless by natural disaster and conflict. Here at ShelterBox, we're working to change that.

We hand-deliver emergency shelter and essential aid items, to help families rebuild, following natural disaster and conflict.

We know that shelter is more than just a roof - it's a home and a foundation for life. Having somewhere dry and warm to sleep, to prepare meals, and to be with your family is vital for starting the long process of rebuilding your life.

That's why our teams work with disaster-hit families around the world, distributing emergency shelter, to transform despair into hope.

OUR VISION: A world where no family is without shelter after disaster.

OUR MISSION: To provide emergency shelter to families who have lost their home to disaster, enabling them to rebuild their lives. We work with our global network to go to hard-to-reach communities, often overlooked by others, to provide vulnerable families with a place to call home. We support communities around the world to recover from some of the worst days of their lives.

We go to the ends of the earth to deliver the essentials people need to begin rebuilding their lives after disaster.

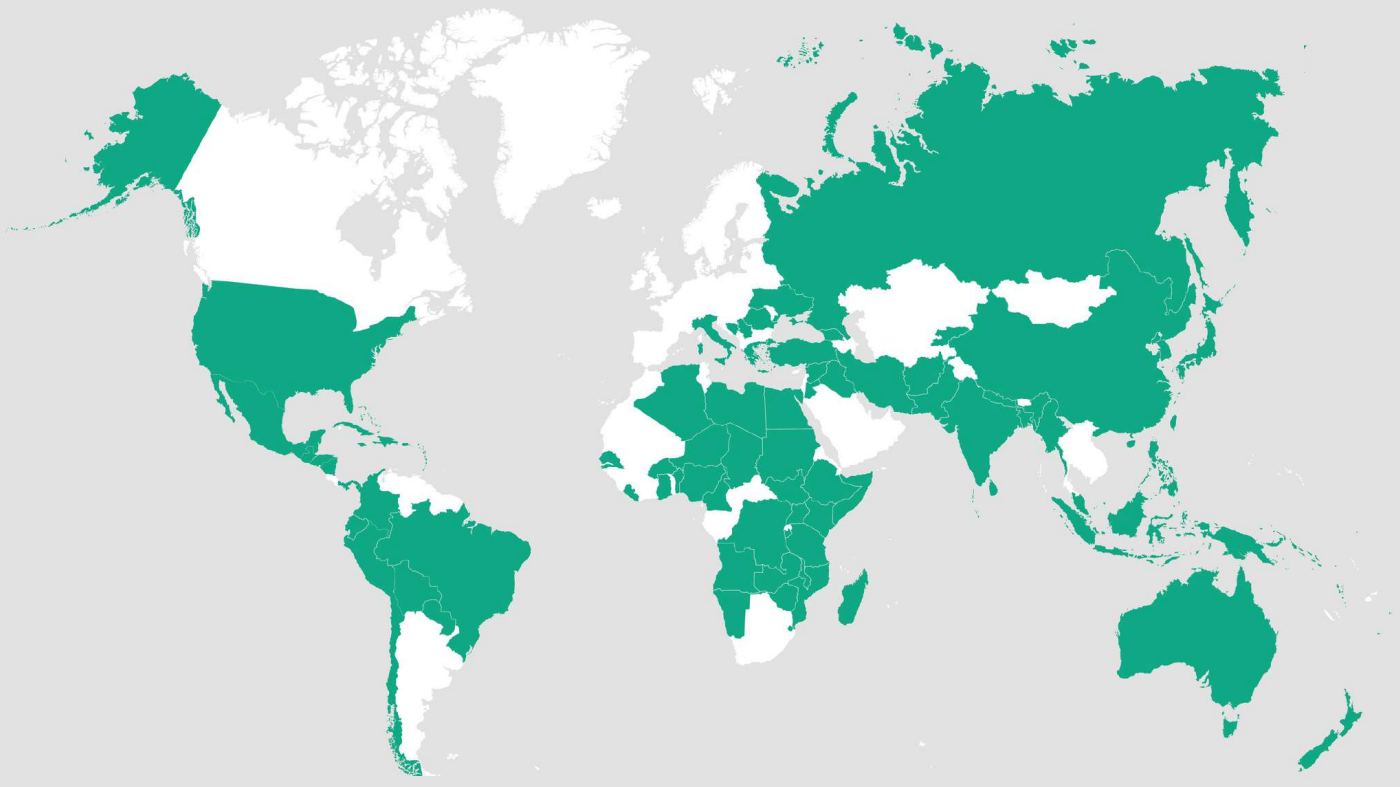


COMMUNITY RECOVERY:
