- Why shelter? We know that shelter is more than just four walls and a roof it's a home, and a foundation for life, family, and community. Having somewhere dry and warm to sleep, prepare meals, and be with your family, is vital for starting the long process of rebuilding your life.
- Our aid comes in the form of our signature green ShelterBoxes, which contain a selection of aid items, such as:
 - o a family-sized tent (to stay protected from the elements)
 - o blankets, mattresses and groundsheets (for warmth and comfort)
 - solar lights (to enable families to stay safe after dark)
 - o cooking sets (so families can spend time cooking together, for normality and nourishment)
 - water containers (so families can access safe drinking water)
 - o mosquito nets (to keep families safe in countries where insect-borne diseases are common)
 - hygiene kits (to help families protect themselves from Covid-19
- We also provide ShelterKits, which help families make emergency shelters and immediate repairs to damaged buildings.
- Since our establishment in 2000, we have provided shelter to 2 million people in 98 countries.
